#### **Economics at LSE**

The Department of Economics is the top ranked economics department in Europe and among the top 12 worldwide. It is one of the largest economics departments in the world, with over 60 faculty and 1,000 students and a department which makes a significant global contribution.


The innovative work of our academics is having a real impact on contemporary issues and challenges, as is their active role as policy advisors to governmental bodies. With work in global climate change, China and India in globalisation, AIDS in Africa, management of technology, and other large issues which are simultaneously contemporary and enduring, the Department continues to set and drive the agenda for research and policy debate everywhere. Alumni are also enacting change as economists in diverse roles in national and international organizations and government.

Ten former members of staff or students from the Department of Economics have been awarded the Nobel Prize in Economics.

The support of alumni and friends in the last five years has enabled the Department to maintain its academic reputation and further its institutional global position, by supporting world-class academics and their research and supporting some of the best and brightest students from across the globe.

This is just the start of our long term ambitions; these goals will need long term investment. With the continued support of alumni and friends we are focusing on the following strategic priorities to strengthen key areas and propel our Department's ranking into the global top five.

- To target prominent senior-level appointments
- To strengthen junior-level academic recruitment

#### PhD Partnership

The Department of Economics was the first to introduce the PhD Partnership Scheme at LSE, a three-way partnership funding model providing full four-year PhD scholarships to outstanding candidates.

Under the Scheme, LSE grants an award to cover tuition fees while the Department of Economics and a private donor jointly fund a maintenance stipend.

The scheme has proved a great success, but with over 300 PhD applicants to LSE each year, scholarship support has never been more vital to ensure that the most talented students can study at LSE, regardless of their financial capacity.
